# What is CDBG-DR

---

- Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) grant funds are appropriated by Congress and allocated by HUD to rebuild disaster-impacted areas and provide crucial seed money to start the long-term recovery process.
- These flexible grants help cities, counties, Indian tribes, and States recover from Presidentially declared disasters, especially in low-income areas, subject to availability of supplemental appropriations.
- Since CDBG-DR assistance may fund a broad range of recovery activities, HUD can help communities and neighborhoods that otherwise might not recover due to limited resources.

# CDBG-DR Funding Process

---

## Congress

Passes special CDBG-DR Appropriation signed by the President.

## HUD

Determines and announces grantee allocations.

Publishes a Notice in the **Federal Register**.

Awards funds via a grant agreement to the State or Local Government (the Grantee).

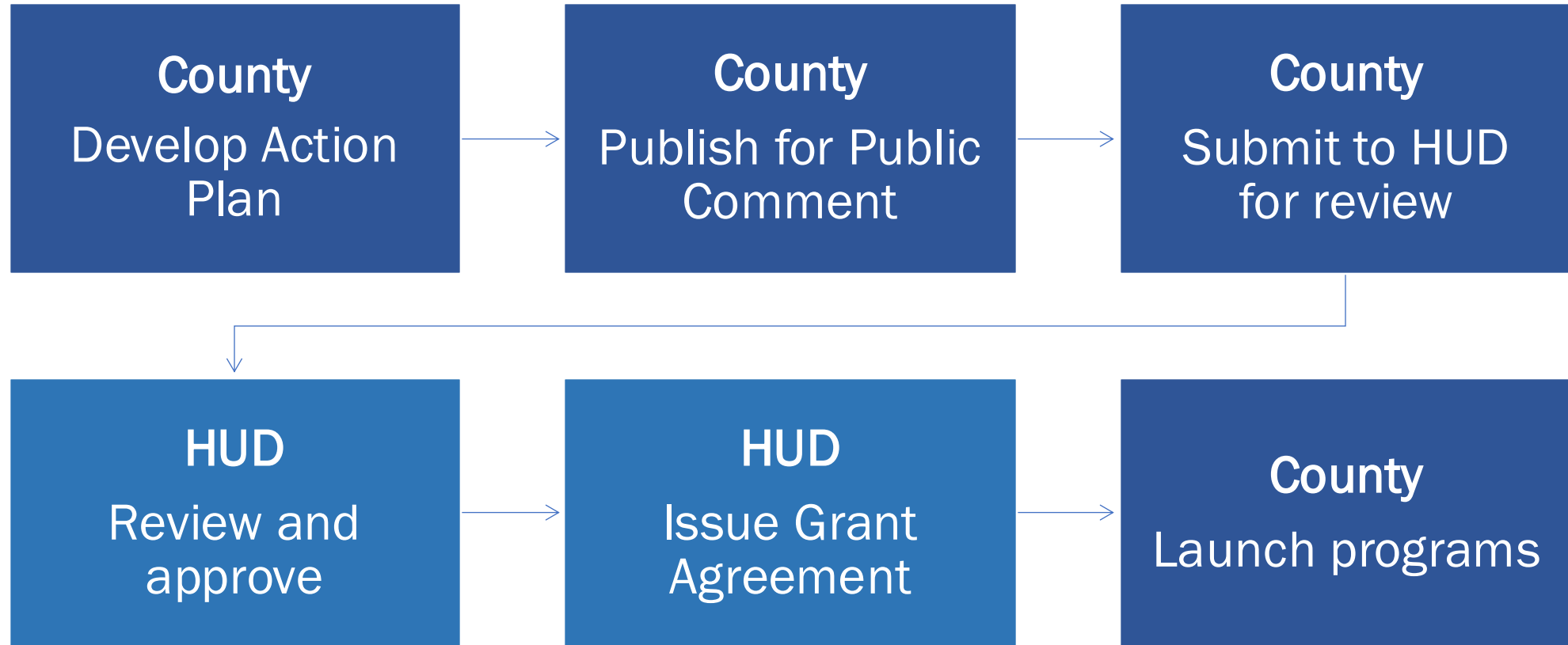
## Grantee

Prepares and publishes Action Plan.

Administers and implements recovery and mitigation programs, either directly, and/or via subrecipients.

# Action Plan Requirements

---

- County must conduct an unmet needs assessment
- Programs/projects must address Unmet (or Mitigation) Needs
- Program budgets must be “proportionate” to identified unmet needs
- County must consult the public and stakeholders in development of the Action Plan
- 70% of allocated funding must benefit Low- to Moderate- Income People

# Expenditure Requirements (Per HUD)

---

Funding	\$ Amount
Unmet Need	\$707,637,000
Mitigation 15% Set-Aside	\$106,146,000
<b>Total Allocation</b>	<b>\$813,783,000</b>
Administration Cap (5%)	\$40,689,150

**\*70% of Program Funding must be spent to benefit Low – to Moderate Income (LMI) People**

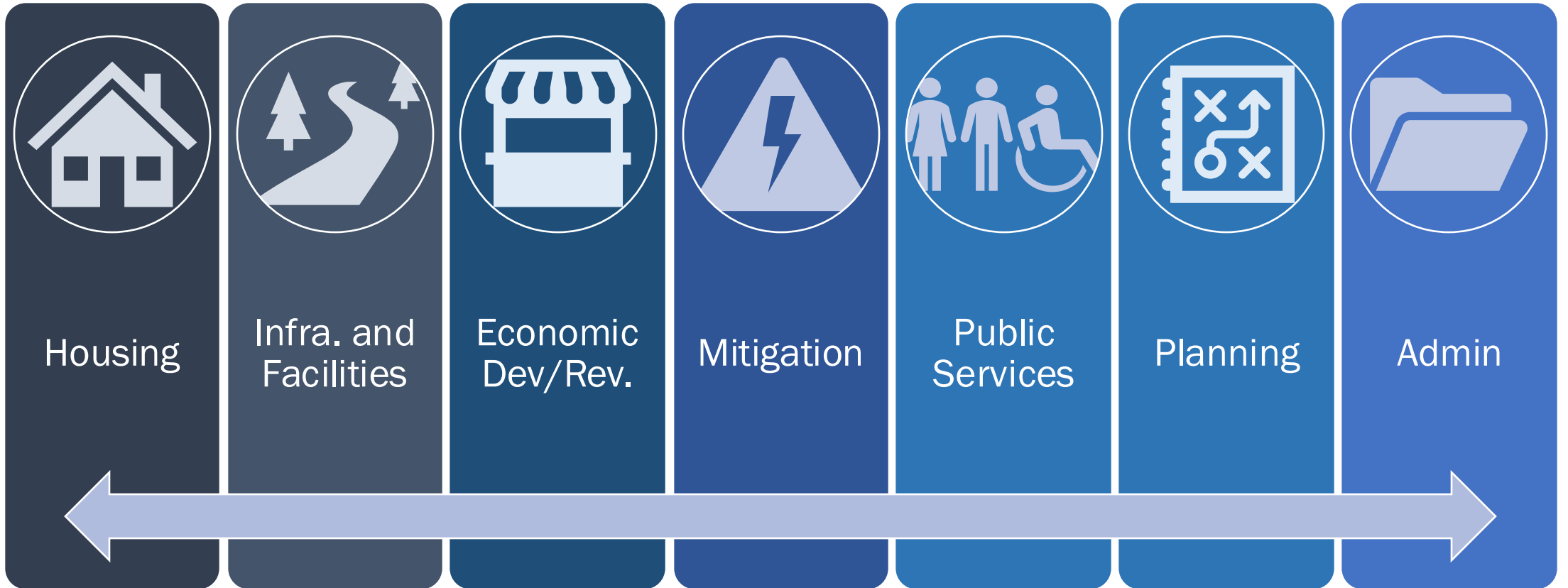

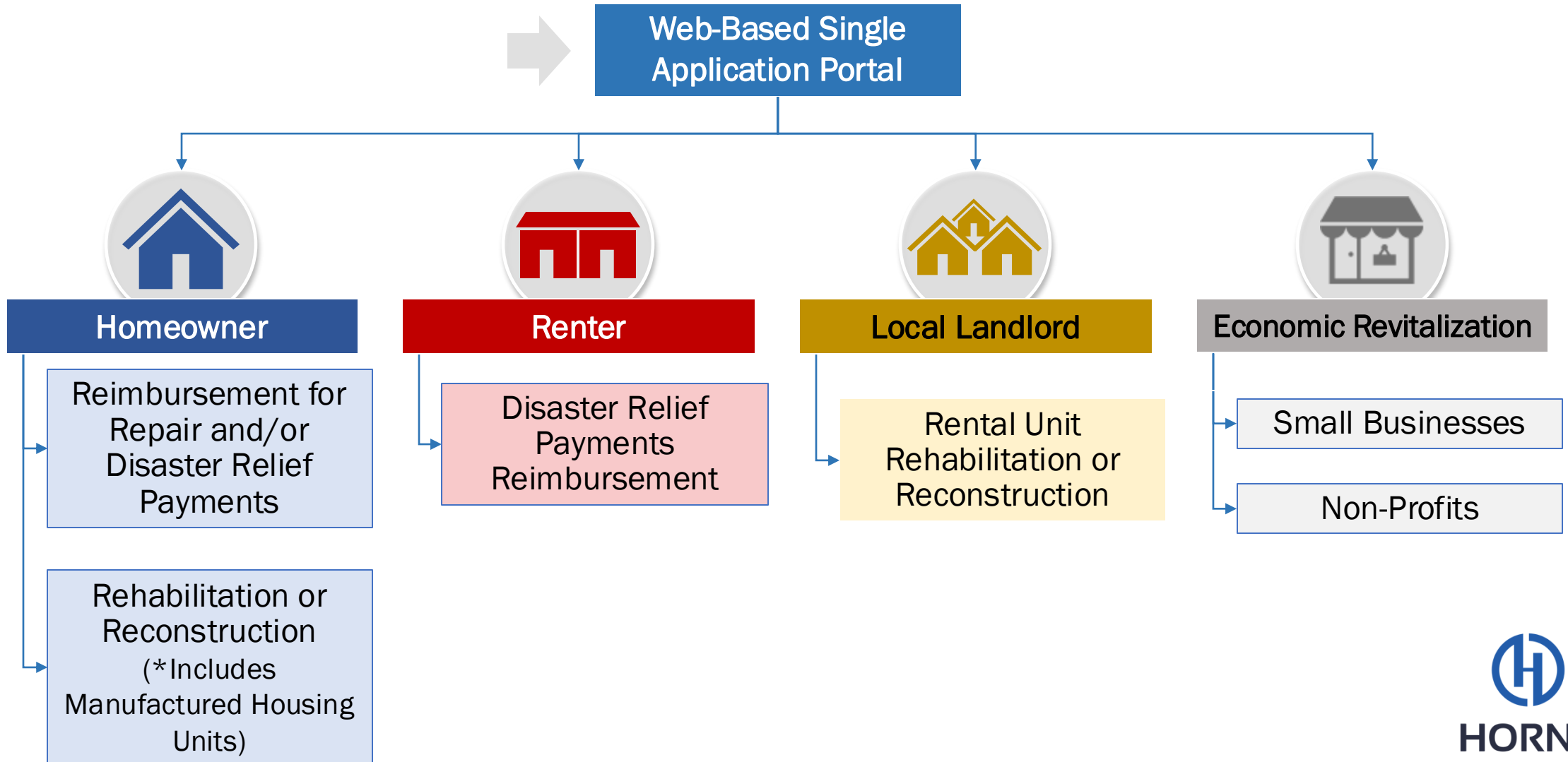

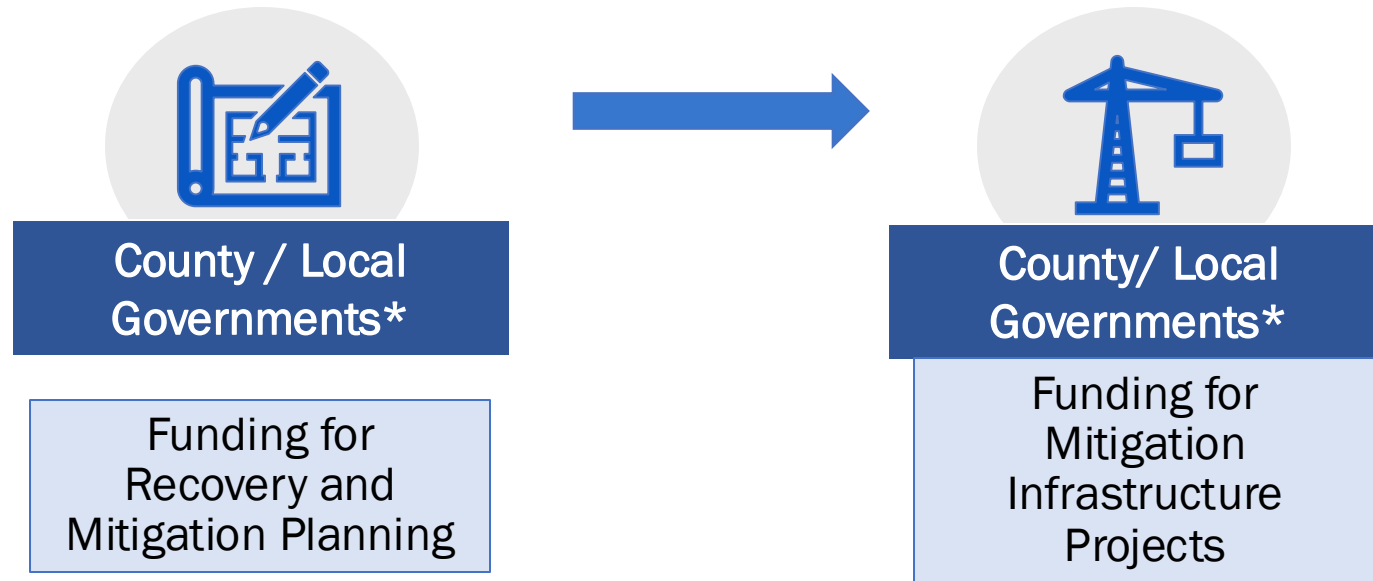


# Proposed “People First” Programs

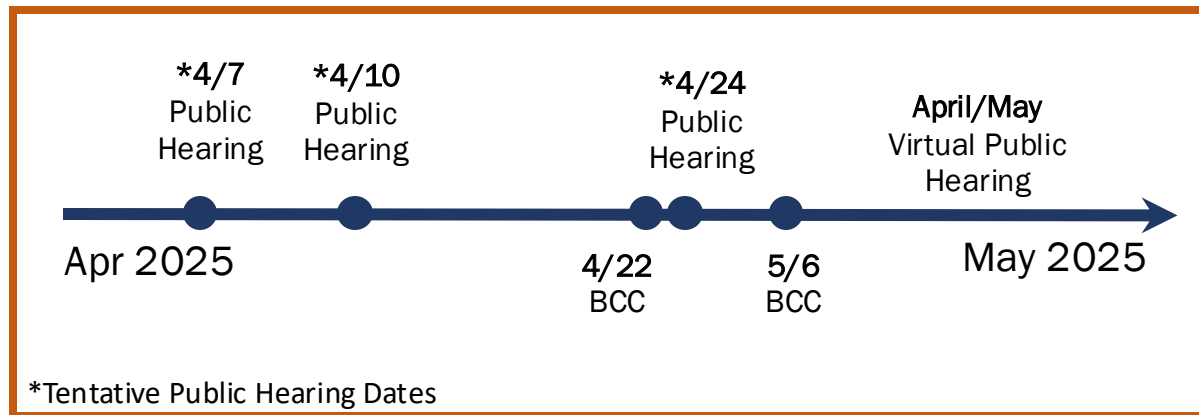
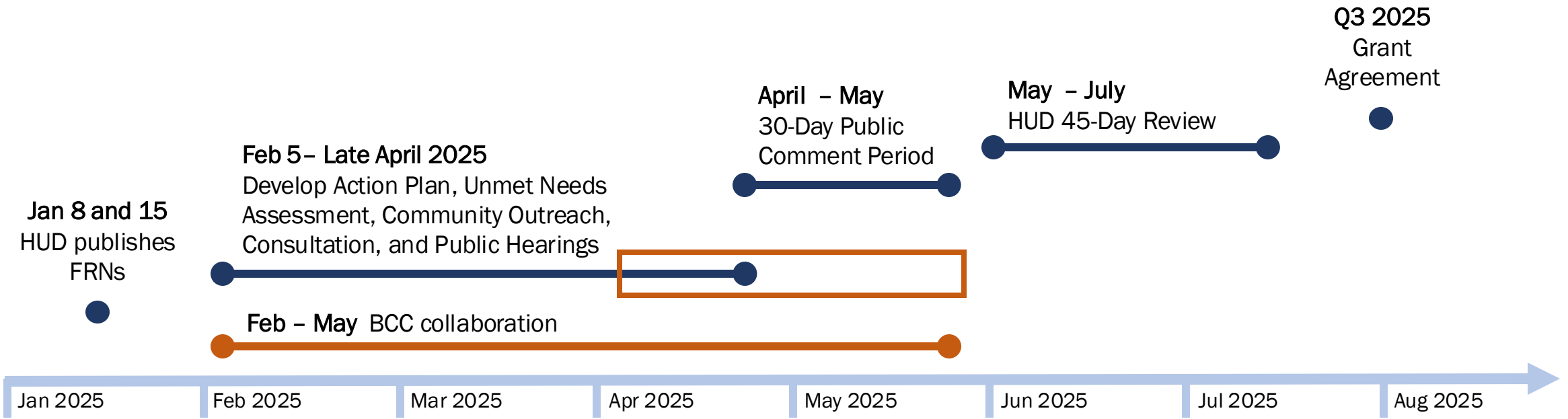


# Proposed Mitigation and Infrastructure Programs
